REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING CALL TO ORDER

CONSENT AGENDA

Nichole Curtis made a motion to approve the following. Payroll check's 26058 - 26087 in the amount of \$35,789.30 dated June 30, 2022. Accounts Payable check's 26088 -26103 in the amount of \$35,124.80 dated July 5, 2022. Approval of minutes from June 21, 2022, for regular council session. Roy Scheibner seconded, all approved.

REGULAR SESSION

Citizen comments – John Blair wanted to talk with council regarding his neighbors who are in violation of a Town code, living in an RV. John was advised that his neighbors have been notified and the Town is working with the sheriff's office on how to proceed. John Blair also mentioned the very tall grass at 115 Brace Street. Cathy Hayes asked council about getting a property line variance to build a fence. Wes Hill spoke about his disagreement with any dredging of Goose Creek.

NEW BUSINESS

Lincoln Co. Sheriff's Office May and June Stats - Interim Sheriff Gabe Gantz read the stats.

Goose Creek Cleanup - Information from Washington State Department of Transportation was handed out to council. Councilmembers will look over the documents and this subject will be on the next council agenda.

Blocked Roadways - Joel Krause has not found any ordinances in the Town that would help keep vehicles from blocking the view of drivers in residential areas. He would like to see if there is any way to ask the residents to be mindful of where they park.

Nuisance Director Interview - There will be an interview to fill the position of Nuisance Director this next Monday, July 11th at 10am. John Hanon and Joel Krause volunteered to sit in on the interview.

Purchase of AED's - Melissa advised council that the Town should have at least two additional defibrillators, one for Town Hall and one for the public works crew to carry. Money from the Coronavirus funds can be allocated to cover the expense. The Mayor and Council agreed.

June's Foreman's Report

Interim Public Works Foreman – Mayor Hearrean advised Council that an interim foreman needs to be appointed. Tim Jennings has been covering this position since David Bjorson has been out due to medical issues. Tim was appointed and there was a discussion on a temporary pay increase for both Tim and Dustin. A cost sheet was given to the Mayor and Council. Lynn McWhorter made a motion to appoint Tim Jennings as

the Interim Foreman with a temporary pay increase retroactive to April 1^s, 2022, John Hanon seconded, all approved. Lynn McWhorter made a motion to allot a temporary pay increase to Dustin Taylor retroactive to April 1^s, 2022, John Hanon seconded, all approved.

OLD BUSINESS

Town Park Playground - Melissa is still working on the list of grants that Lynn McWhorter had sent to her. Swim Pool Roof Estimate - Council was given the estimates to either temporarily fix the roof or to replace the roof. These amounts will also be discussed with the Pool Foundation. More to come at a future meeting.
